




































Lignum Vitae



Nature's Self-Lubricating Wood A Nautical Past

Lignum Vitae

(Guaiacum officinale, G. sanctum)
Number 4 on the Hitchcock & King (the UK's Home Depot) list of the 10 hardest woods, Lignum Vitae (Latin for "Tree of Life") was used as bearing material on sailing ships, the naturally occurring oils, eliminating the need to lubricate a pulley shaft. It is still in use today as the naturally occurring oils eliminate the need for petroleum-based lubricants.


