## **2014 Dues**

## **Holiday Party**

## October Demo - Threading Jig

Rick Nye did the October demo on using the Bonnie Klein threading jig. The jig is used to mount your work-piece on, and a bit goes in the headstock to cut the threads. The jig moves your piece forward as the cutter spins. When starting this project, the most important thing to remember is to start with dry, stable wood. When doing the layout for your project remember your rule of thirds, one third for the lid, and two thirds for the base.

Also you will loose 1/4 inch when separating the lid from the base. Rich showed us how to use the threading jig on the lid and the base, using multiple





shallow passes to avoid chipout. For softer woods, use CA to stabilize the wood where you will be cutting the threads. This is a great tool to take your boxes to the next level. The handout that Rich provided can be found at:
