Once Upon A Christmas

In the middle of downtown Lisle there is a collection of historic buildings including a farmhouse, a tavern, a depot, a caboose and a blacksmith shop – collectively, the site is called The Museums of Lisle Station Park. This park is jointly operated by the Village of Lisle, The Heritage Society, and Lisle Park District (our host). In addition to operating as a meeting venue and a museum, Lisle Station Park sponsors special events including one at Christmas called Once Upon a Christmas which will be on December 7 and 8.

The Blacksmith Shop is generally operational at these events. There is also a woodworking area in the blacksmith shop which includes an old wooden treadle lathe. At past events, the wooden lathe has been used to demonstrate spindle turning. We have been contacted by Brian Failing, the museum curator asking if Windy City would be interested in running the turning demonstration at the December event. The curator is open to power lathes being involved in the demonstration.

This is another opportunity to support an activity connected with the Lisle Park District. The open hours for the event are 3pm to 8pm Saturday and 11am to 4pm Sunday. We would need a couple of members to investigate and plan our involvement. Interested parties should contact Don Johnston at (708) 482-7628.
