
Registration is Open for Turn-On! Chicago

January Demo—Using jigs

The January demo featured Roy Lindley in his discussion on how to use jigs to make turning easier. The picture shown to the right is an example of the many jigs Roy uses for turning.

Roy showed us how to create a tapped adapter out of wood for mounting to the threads on your headstock. He started with drilling a hole 1/8" smaller than the diameter of the tap. In this case he used a 7/8" bit for a 1" thread size.

Next he showed us how to tap the threads, by putting a live center in the tailstock and locking the headstock with the block of wood mounted with the hole drilled toward the tailstock. He put the tap between the hole and the live center, and advanced the tailstock while turning the tap. This takes a little practice to make both of these moves at the same time.

Roy discussed many different examples of jigs he has created and used in his turnings.

Andre Martel to Demonstrate March 8 - by Paul Shotola

On Saturday, March 8, Andre Martel will demonstrate at Christian Liberty Academy in Arlington Heights. Andre, from Saint-Cesaire, Quebec, Canada, specializes in end-grain turning, producing delicate, transparent Lamp Shades and goblets from wet logs.

Audiences world-wide have been mesmerized by the long, flowing ribbons of wood shavings at Andre Martel demonstrations. On Saturday, March 8, he will demonstrate the techniques so you can produce similar shavings on your own. Well, maybe with a little practice, but you'll have the knowledge to do so. Like high school French, the more you use it, the more proficient you become. He is the inventor and developer of the Martel Hook Tool and will demonstrate its use and the use of other woodturning tools. Demonstrating and teaching for over twenty years, Andre Has taught such notables as Jean-Francois Escoulen, Alan Mailland, Johannes Michelson and a host of professional turners in France and Europe. He is a frequent demonstrator for the American Association of Woodturners national symposia, regional chapters and turning groups world-wide. His presentation at Christian Liberty Academy will start at 9:00AM and run all day, finishing up about 4:30PM. Morning coffee and snacks will be provided by the Chicago Wood-turners.
