34th Annual Heritage Ornament is a Collaborative Effort

The Ornament Story

The Windy City Woodturners Club meets at the Lisle Park District Recreation Center. The club has had a focus on supporting the Park District and Lisle community events. This led to a connection with the Museums at Lisle Station Park and participation in "Once Upon a Christmas."

Last year at that event, one of our members noticed the Christmas ornaments on sale. She wondered if we could find a way to support that effort. The Windy City board decided to investigate the possibilities. The short story is that with Carol Carls' creative input the collaboration became the 2015 ornament offering.

Some 18 club members contributed to the production of 150 snowmen heads and hats. Each turner used a diagram called a 'story stick' from which they would transfer critical points in the shape of the snowman from its top to bottom. The diagram also gave information on diameters along the shape. Then it is a matter of connecting the points to make a shape similar to the diagram. This 'story stick' approach is one which has been used for ages to make matching table legs, stair spindles and the like. The wood selected for the ornament was basswood because it is light weight and has a fairly fine and uniform grain.

Windy City Woodturners is a club dedicated to the art / craft / hobby of turning wooden objects. The club is one of some 350 clubs across the country affiliated with The American Association of Woodturners. Formed in 1999 by a handful of members the Windy City club has grown to over 70.

In addition to Lisle Heritage Society Guild president Carol Carls, Cathy Cawiezel, Joan Lavin, Gerry McNellis, Cathy Payton, and Juli Riedl worked on the ornament (in alphabetical order). The limited edition ornament will be available for sale at Depot Days and "Once Upon a Christmas.

All members are encouraged to bring their work to the review. What have you been working on? A new technique? A fresh design? Your fellow members want to know about it. Don't want to have your piece reviewed? No problem. There will be a table for you where you can show your work but it will not be reviewed.

OT (Ornamental Turning) Seminar

The 2015 CWT Ornamental Turning Seminar is officially scheduled for October 9-11 (Friday to Sunday afternoon). This is a 2-1/2 day hands on learning opportunity focusing on taking your ornamental turning project from conception to completion including setting up your rose engine, how to determine what attachments to use and what you need to know to get your design to emerge the way you want it to when you're done. The intent is to break into small groups, choose a shape and then over the course of 2 days learn from each other and our demonstrators how to bring the design from 2-D to 3-D successfully. This is not necessarily a beginner's class, but all are welcome. David Lindow (inventor and manu-





facturer of the Lindow Rose Engine Lathe) and Peter Gerstel (OT enthusiast and teacher) will facilitate the learning process. All attendees will have the opportunity to share their knowledge through these projects. The seminar will be held at NORMAC in Geneva, IL. The cost is \$150 and includes a **Continental Breakfast** Friday, Saturday and Sunday and **Lunch** Friday and Saturday. 


Charles so bring your significant other and if they are not interested in Ornamental Turning, they can enjoy the Scarecrow Festival!






The WCWT Picnic in August was well-attended, with good food, good friends, a wood exchange, and a white elephant raffle.

































OUR MEETINGS
