## April Mtg. Presentation

This month's demo will be Marie Anderson showing us how to marble on woodturnings. Many say marbling, as an art form, originated in Japan in around the 12th Century. (China as well as several other countries in the Middle East dispute this also claiming to be the originators.) Paper was the most common surface to marble at the time. Ink floating across water was used to marble paper. In modern times, the media has been expanded to include ink, acrylic and water based paints with various additives. The technique, though surprisingly similar has been improved. The surfaces to be marbled are limited only by ones imagination. You can find marbling on all sorts of products from art to motorcycle parts, stationary to tennis racquets, clothing to custom guitars (and everything inbetween). Please join us as we learn how to use this ancient art form to embellish woodturnings!




