It was a very lively discussion and many of us came away with ideas on how to slightly tweak a piece (or in some cases completely redesign a piece) to make it more visually appealing. The thing I found fascinating about the discussion was all the different ways of looking at a piece. In one case, it was suggested that a box be made into two different boxes adding an opportunity for more income for the maker. In another case, there were several suggestions on how a small shift in center might make a sculpture more appealing to the eye. In another instance, two boxes with similar shapes were displayed. Both done well technically, but to the maker, one worked and one was not as successful. And in just one case, it was agreed that there was just no hope for that bowl.




### **March Meeting**


