The biggest news in the woodturning world was almost certainly the cancellation of the AAW symposium in Louisville. Followed shortly by the cancellation of Turn-On! Chicago and the Midwest Penturners Gathering. Both of which have immediate impacts on members of our club.

The cancellation of the AAW symposium hit me hard as I was scheduled to demonstrate, I also had a demo and classes in Detroit cancelled and I can absolutely envision a scenario where my scheduled demos and classes in Atlanta in August are in danger. This has forced me to re-evaluate my willingness and feasibility of being able to give live remote video demonstrations from my shop; something I've been hesitant to do up until this point. That will require me to purchase some additional networking and audio/video equipment but that's at least partially offset by not eating out, by saving a ton of money on gas while I'm not commuting to work, and by generally not making any unnecessary purchases for the foreseeable future.




