Message From Our President

Six years ago the AAW decided to hold their annual symposium in Phoenix. February 2020 Meeting - Texturing

In the winter of 1973, I took a adult open shop night course at Rich East High School. There was a lathe in the corner with a rack of bent dull scrapers. I scraped out a cherry candle stand and used a lot of sandpaper. I was hooked, bought a cheap lathe and played with pine 2x4s.

A few years latter I went to a wood show, and while walking through the venders aisle, I saw a group at a table representing a new woodturning club. They were as eager as I to talk about woodturning. The club later became the Chicago Woodturners.

From a member to news editor to Vice President. Since then I have six lathes. Today's is a Robust Long Bed with 3 hp.

As many know I turned mostly bowls. Probably six or seven hundred. I now core almost all my blanks and have a converted freezer as a kiln for drying.

Lately I have been exploring texturing of bowl surfaces. At this month's meeting I will be using the Sorby Mini Texturing Tool. We will discuss the best domestic woods to use, the best sequence for applying, the areas on a bowl to apply texturing. Also the things that can go wrong?

February 2020 Meeting - Texturing

This month's demo will be about embellishing the surface of a bowl using the Sorby Mini Texturing tools. We will discuss wood selection, lathe speed, tool sequence, and application of the wheels. It will explore these applications to face grain and cross grain areas of the bowl. Woods with little grain pattern can be significantly enhanced with a little

texturing.

A quorum of paid members that meets or exceeds 35% of the number of paid members as of December 31st of the previous year must be present.

Article 9 Section E Amended

The officers as a group shall meet periodically as a Board of Directors. The immediate Past President shall sit on the Board of Directors. The Past President shall sit on the Board of Directors in an advisory capacity with voting rights.
